ACLIVILE B The project offers a variety of activities. Each volunteer will

work for two to four organisations/locations. These are all partner organisations that have different goals, target groups and activities. All volunteers work with people with limitations. However, not all activities involve supporting people with limitations. For example there is an urban garden where volunteers help with general garden work and a primary school where volunteers monitor the children during the lunch break. We also support two boxing gyms where volunteer help with the lessons and also can train themselves.

Many activities take place in collaboration with a large care organisation. Their facilities provide care or day activities for people with disabilities or elderly people. The volunteers help to cook meals for residents, support leisure or work related activities or do one on one activities. One on one activities means that volunteers spend a few hours every week with one specific client and help with daily errands or do other small ventures like going for a walk.

Volunteers will be offered a working module of around 34 hours. Together with a Lava Legato representative and the other volunteers the working modules are divided. In Rotterdam there are 4 working modules, in Zoetermeer there are 7. Once the volunteer has selected the work module, the volunteer will stay working for these same organisations, until the end of the project. It is possible however that minor adjustments have to be made throughout the project, based on the schedule of the organisation. For instance, a primary school does not have activities during the summer break, so these activities will be replaced by other actives during the summer.

umber of volunteers

The number of volunteers that we host is at least eleven in the area of Rotterdam and Zoetermeer. Four volunteers live in Rotterdam, seven to eight volunteers live in Zoetermeer. Please note that you can express your preference for Zoetermeer or Rotterdam, but Lava Legato will select which volunteers will be placed where: Rotterdam or Zoetermeer. Please note that only volunteers with a European passport or a permanent residency can apply for the project. This limitation is related to legal procedures that are valid in the Netherlands.

Event for children organised by Lava Legato (2021)



The volunteers in Rotterdam share bathroom, kitchen and toilet. The apartment also includes a living room and a balcony. Smoking is prohibited both inside the apartment and on the balcony.

The volunteers in Zoetermeer share kitchen, three toilets, and four showers. A large living room adjoins a small garden at the back. The accommodations are each equipped with the following: cushion and matras protector, duvet, kitchen and cleaning utensils.

The following is requested to bring one's own towels, bed sheets and duvet and cushion covers.

For the first payment, the volunteer will receive the money cash, upon arrival.

A cleaning guarantee of € 150 is paid upon arrival by the volunteer. This amount is returned when the volunteer leaves the apartment/house in a clean status.

The volunteer will receive a lease bicycle for which a lease contract is signed by the volunteer. It is important that the volunteer knows how to ride a bicycle, because this is the way of transportation that the volunteer will mainly use to go to the volunteer activities.

International travel costs are reimbursed based on fixed lump sum amounts that are based on the number of kilometers between the volunteer's home address and the living address in the Netherlands. Green travel is highly promoted.

SUPPORT & TRAINING

Volunteers are supported throughout the duration of the project and have the opportunity to evaluate the project during biweekly meetings with the project coordinator. In the first week after arrival the Lava Legato foundation organises introduction meetings. Different topics (house rules, working with people with limitations, etc.) will be discussed and the volunteers are also requested to present themselves for the group. The Dutch National Agency organises an on arrival training and a midterm training. A mentor is appointed to the volunteers in Zoetermeer, another mentor is appointed to the volunteers in Rotterdam. The role of the mentor is to support volunteers, mainly with practical questions and issues that might arise. Group meetings are organised in collaboration between the mentor and the volunteers. Individual meetings with the mentor can take place upon request. Language lessons are provided, either online or face to face.

O L H E R S P E C I F I C A L I O N S In preparation for the

project (before arrival) various papers must be applied for. Since, among other things, work is done with children and people with limitations, it is necessary to obtain an official certificate of good conduct. Also, a Volunteering Agreement is created and signed by the volunteer, the supporting organisation and the hosting organisation. A supporting organisation has to be chosen by the volunteer. This organization supports the volunteer during the preparation and is also available during the project as an additional contact. It is located in the volunteer's home country, ideally close to where the volunteer lives. In addition, the volunteer is covered for health costs by the insurance company Henner. The volunteer must register with the insurance company and create an account for the stay abroad. A volunteer needs to obtain an EHIC card before arrival.

Stay overs by visitors and days off must be announced in time. The volunteer gets two days off per month. It is allowed to take five days off in a row and visitors are also allowed to stay over for a total of five nights for the period of the project.

Volunteers use a bicycle to get to and from work. It is therefore important that they are able to ride a bicycle, also in not ideal weather circumstances.

In addition to the already diverse work, the volunteer has the possibility to do a personal project. Besides the fact that it should be related to the general aim of ESC and one of the criteria: sustainability, visibility of ESC, art & creative expression, and/or active citizenship.
